GVGS FOUNDATION SOCIAL JUSTICE SCHOLARSHIP – ABORIGINAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP - YEAR 7, 2026 ENTRY

INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

The GVGS Social Justice - Aboriginal Student Scholarship has been established to provide exceptional educational opportunities for an Aboriginal student who has the potential to lead within the community. This Scholarship will be awarded to a student for Year 7 entry in 2026.

WHAT THE SCHOLARSHIP PROVIDES

The Scholarship covers all compulsory school fees for Years 7 to 12. This includes Tuition Fee, Capital Charge and Fixed Charge. Parents are expected to pay for textbooks, school uniform, travel expenses and other optional items not covered by fees.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for this scholarship, student applicants need to demonstrate the following:

- identify as Aboriginal and acceptance as such by the community in which they live
- eligible to enter Year 7 in 2026 (completing Year 6 in 2025)
- should have sufficient self-confidence and personal support to enter a new school at Year 7 with the intention of continuing to Year 12.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic levels and achievements of a student are considered but are not the predominant criteria for selection. Selection is based on consideration of the following criteria:

Commitment

Demonstrated determination to attend school regularly and complete Year 12.

Attitude

- a love of learning
- ability to adjust positively to the school environment
- the social skills and confidence to relate well to others

Academic effort and progress

The student demonstrates qualities which will assist them to cope with the demands of the curriculum:

- reasonable literacy and numeracy levels
- sound work habits (organisation, completion of homework)
- diligence, determination and a willingness to attempt new work

Community Service

Contribution to and involvement in the local community

Co-curricular

Willingness to actively participate in the school's co-curricular programme including Performing Arts, Sport and Service

Parent Support

- a commitment to the importance of education
- willingness to support their son / daughter's full participation in the co-curricular programmes of the school
- support of the school's values, culture and expectations

SATISFACTORY PROGRESS

It is expected that the scholarship recipient will, throughout their time at the school, demonstrate a commitment to strive to meet academic goals. This would include satisfactory progress and participation in all school programmes. The scholarship will be subject to an annual review based on the above expectations. Should there be significant concerns, the Principal will conduct a review and, in extreme cases, may terminate the scholarship.

SELECTION PROCESS

1. Written Application

Using the following application form, complete a written application and submit by the closing date.

2. Short Listing

A panel will consider all applications and will prepare a short list of candidates.

3. Interview

Short listed candidates and their parents will be invited to an interview with the selection panel. A second interview may be required.

4. Final Selection

All candidates will be contacted in writing regarding the final decision of the panel.
