GVGS FOUNDATION SOCIAL JUSTICE SCHOLARSHIP - REFUGEE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP - YEAR 7, 2026 ENTRY

INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

The GVGS Social Justice - Refugee Student Scholarship has been established to provide exceptional educational opportunities for a refugee student. This Scholarship will be awarded to a refugee student for Year 7 entry in 2026.

WHAT THE SCHOLARSHIP PROVIDES

The Scholarship covers all compulsory school fees for Years 7 to 12. This includes Tuition Fee, Capital Charge and Fixed Charge.

Parents are expected to pay for textbooks, school uniform, travel expenses and other optional items not covered by fees.

ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for this scholarship, student applicants need to demonstrate the following:

- be an Australian Citizen or Permanent Resident who arrived in Australia from a refugee* background
- eligible to enter Year 7 in 2026 (completing Year 6 in 2025)
- should have sufficient self-confidence and personal support to enter a new school at Year 7 with the intention of continuing to Year 12
- have attended an Australian primary school for at least two years before commencing Year 7

SELECTION CRITERIA

Academic levels and achievements of a student are considered but are not the predominant criteria for selection. Selection is based on consideration of the following criteria:

Commitment

Demonstrated determination to attend school regularly and complete Year 12.

Attitude

- a love of learning
- ability to adjust positively to the school environment
- the social skills and confidence to relate well to others

Academic effort and progress

The student demonstrates qualities which will assist them to cope with the demands of the curriculum:

- reasonable literacy and numeracy levels
- sound work habits (organisation, completion of homework)
- diligence, determination and a willingness to attempt new work

Educational Disadvantage

As a result of their refugee background the student has experienced:

- educational disadvantage
- financial need

Community Service

Contribution to and involvement in their local community

^{*}includes asylum seekers, humanitarian entrants and others who have had a refugee-like experience.

Co-curricular

Willingness to actively participate in the co-curricular programme including Performing Arts, Sport and Service

Parent Support

- a commitment to the importance of education
- a determination to provide an environment in which the student can achieve their academic potential
- willingness to support their son / daughter's full participation in the co-curricular programmes of the school
- support of the school's values, culture and expectations

SATISFACTORY PROGRESS

It is expected that the scholarship recipient will, throughout their time at the school, demonstrate a commitment to strive for excellence. This would include satisfactory progress and participation in all school programmes. The scholarship will be subject to an annual review based on the above expectations. Should there be significant concerns, the Principal will conduct a review and, in extreme cases, may terminate the scholarship.

SELECTION PROCESS

1. Written Application

Using the following application form, complete a written application and submit by the closing date.

2. Short Listing

A panel will consider all applications and will prepare a short list of candidates.

3 Interview

Short listed candidates and their parents will be invited to an interview with the selection panel. If requested prior to the interview the school can arrange for an interpreter. A second interview may be requested.

4. Final Selection

All candidates will be contacted in writing regarding the final decision of the panel.
